Acting President's Report May 2026

Well, despite the Fishing Competition being cancelled due to the algae bloom, we still had a big weekend around town. Activities focused on the Community Hall, with around 100 people attending Friday night drinks and people being packed four deep at the bar! For the first time ever we had to have two bar men to cope with the crowd! An enjoyable night was had by all. The next morning, we had around 100 people attend for the pancake breakfast, another great success. That night we saw over 100 people attend bingo. The Fishing Comp raffle was drawn at an event on Sunday night with around 80 people attending for a free barby. (Raffle winners are published later in the newsletter). All in all, we had some fantastic community events over the holiday break.

In relation to the algae bloom, water testing conducted on April 6 shows no indication of it in Hardwicke Bay. The water is clear, there is no smell, no dead fish on the beaches and hopefully it will be gone for good. There have now been several reports of people catching their whiting bag limits locally, but I have had no reports of squid being caught as yet.

In relation to our fishing stocks, it is very disappointing to see that some new shack owners in town have been caught several times by the Fisheries for taking undersize and over bag limit fish. The locals all know who they are and what they are up to and have a direct line to the Fisheries compliance officers. Your activities are not welcome in our town.

While we are talking about inappropriate behaviour, whoever the anonymous person is that continues to write letters to the Progress Association encouraging us to "take action to make shack owners and their loved ones aware" about a person convicted 18 years ago of an offence who has a shack in town, you are wasting your paper and time! What would you like us to do, tar and feature the person in the main street, burn an effigy of them, place them in stocks and throw rotten fruit at them? Really? Your letter lit my fire tonight, just like the other ones. Desist.

Coming up at the hall are two events, firstly on Saturday the 2 May we

have our annual quiz night, put together by Linda Campell. Get a table together and come along for a fun night. The next weekend we have our monthly May dinner which will also serve as a thank you and farewell to Barb Winter, who has served a remarkable 40 years on our committee!

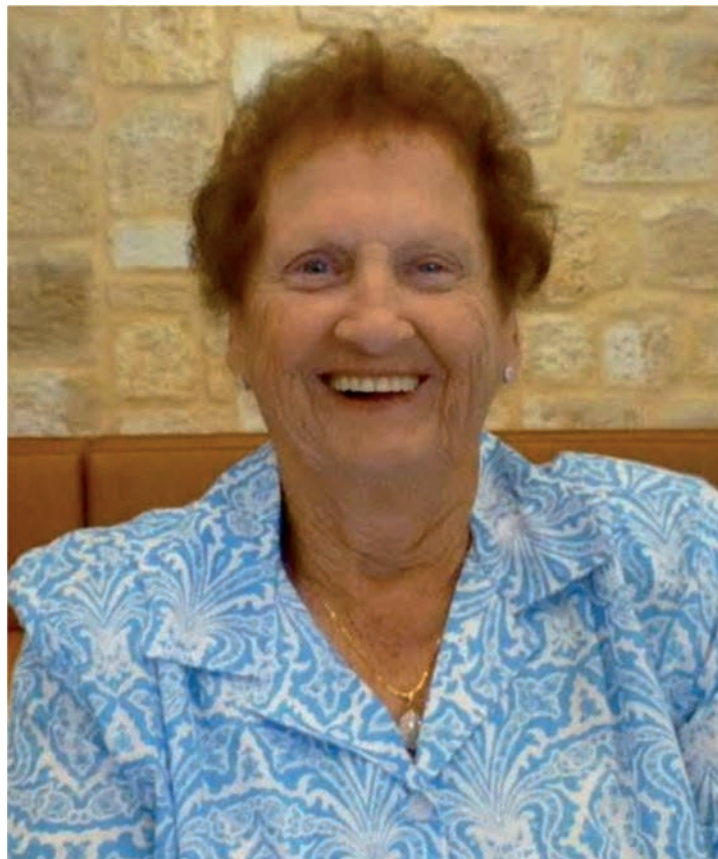

YP Waste and Recycling Calendar

Hardwicke Bay is **area two** in the waste schedule (represented by the aqua dates for rubbish and yellow for recycling) and collection is on **Wednesdays**. Garden organics are scheduled **monthly** (represented by the dark green dates) and collected on **Thursdays**.

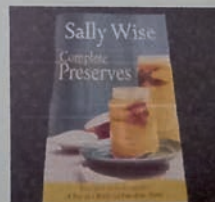

A Few Jokes to Amuse You One Liners This Month

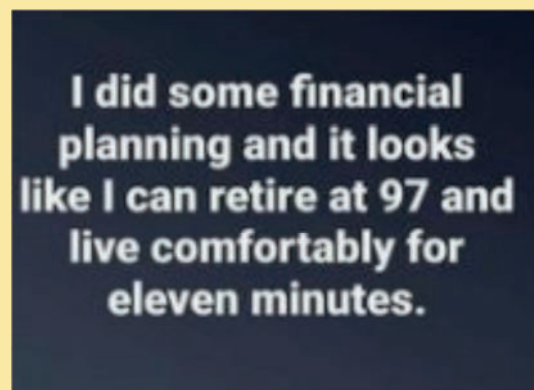
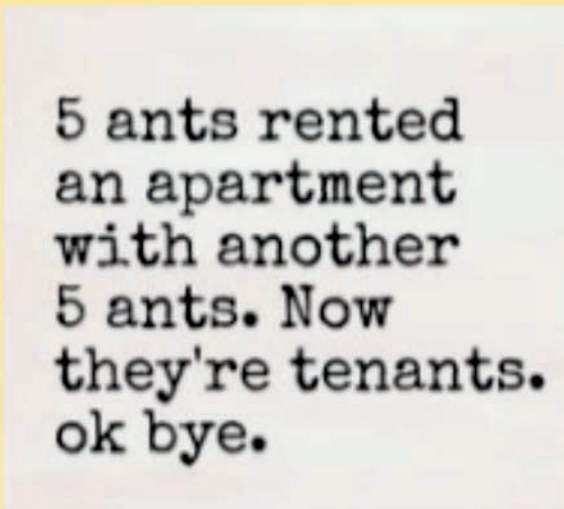
My wife and I were sitting at a table at her high school reunion, and she kept staring at a drunken man swigging his drink as he sat alone at a nearby table.

BEACH TRAKKA WHEELCHAIR



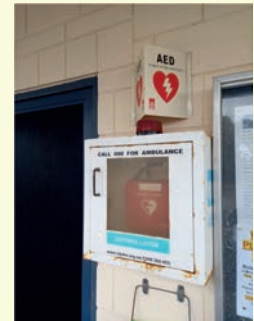
The Progress Association has a Beach Trakka off road wheelchair. This can be used by anyone in the community (Hardwicke Bay and Yorke Peninsula and visitors) to give the disabled or the elderly access to the sea for a dip. This is designed to be pushed easily across the soft sand and seaweed, straight into the water and allows people with mobility challenges to enjoy the beach environment and to access the water and have a paddle without having to leave the chair.

To gain access to the shed where the device is stored, contact Ashley on 0429 398 848 for the access code. There is a sign out book with an indemnity that must be filled in and upon return the wheelchair must be washed down with a hose that is provided from the nearby tap.



AED (Automated External Defibrillator)

There are two AEDs in Hardwicke Bay. They are located in front of Community Hall, 5 Progress Road, Hardwicke Bay and at the Beach Shelter near Boat Ramp, South Shore Road.

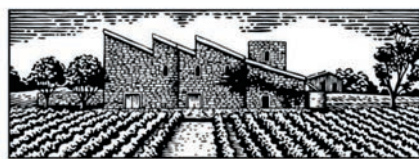

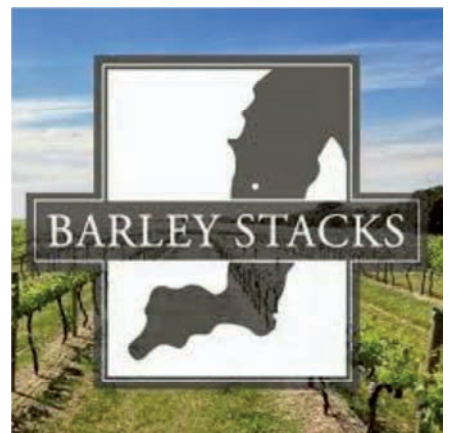
